Foreign Athletes will be invited through their home NF.

2. All athletes placed 1<sup>st</sup> -3<sup>rd</sup> in the Riders Tour Final Ranking 2008.

b. Further foreign Athletes (up to a total of 23 foreign Athletes)

1. Further foreign Athletes who are invited through their home NF

50 % of these Athletes must be selected from the top 300 of the Rolex Rankings No. 97, 50 % are free (ranked or unranked Athletes).

2. The FEI has the right to nominate two foreign Athletes

3. 15 % of all Athletes may receive a wildcard, however these Athletes must be selected from the top 600 of the Rolex Rankings No. 97.

- c. Further German Athletes (up to a total of 32 German Athletes)
1. German Athletes of the DOKR championship cadre 2009 jumping
  2. Up to two German Juniors/Young Riders nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
  3. Up to a total number of approx. 32 German Athletes either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ration: per 4 Athletes nominated by the federal trainer jumping one Athlete can be personally invited by the organizer.

Number of horses per athlete:

Per athlete 3 horses of 7 years or over. Plus 1 horse (7 or 8 years old) in classes 1–3. Horses, which are ridden in the youngsters-tour may not be started in any other competition of the event.

#### **B. CSI-Amateurs**

- approx. 20 foreign Athletes who will be invited by the organizer through their home NF
- approx. 30 German Athletes who will be invited by the organizer

All Athletes:

- Number of horses per Athlete: 3, however per competition only two horses permitted.
- Admitted are only Athletes who do not make a living (neither fully nor partly) from riding, dealing, training of horses and/or Athletes with own horses or horses belonging to other family members. The buying and selling of horses as well as receiving prize money in cash are not forbidden, providing they so not constitute the Athlete's only source of income.
- Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, Athletes are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the Athlete holds the „Amateur Owner“ status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater. The Amateur Owner licence will be issued by the Athletes' respective NF and has to be applied for by the Athlete in due time before the begin of the event.
- Amateur-Owner Athletes need an "Amateur-Owner licence" of their home NF and has to be applied for in due time before the begin of the event.

#### **C. CDI 4\***

1. Big Tour

a. Foreign Athletes:

Invited NFs: it is intended to invite:

AUS (2), DEN (2), ESP (2) GBR (2), SUI (2), SWE (2), USA (2).

Reserve: FIN (2), JPN (2), RUS (2)

The NFs have the right to decide which athletes to send.

Two horses per athlete, either one horse for the Big Tour and one horse for the Small Tour or two horses for the Big Tour (one horse for competition No. 20 and one horse for competition No. 21). The athletes will be invited by the organizer through their home NF.

b. German athletes

- all members of the DOKR Dressage Championship cadre 2009 (in case athletes of the champions cadre withdraw, the federal trainer may nominated as many further athletes)
- up to four athletes being nominated by the federal trainer dressage in agreement with the organizer.

c. In the BIG TOUR horses aged 8 years and older are allowed to be ridden.

2. Small Tour

- those athletes who are admitted to the BIG TOUR and ride only one horse in the big tour with one horse each.
- three athletes being nominated by the federal trainer dressage in agreement with the organizer.
- in the SMALL TOUR horses aged 7 years and older are allowed to be ridden.

3. Wildcards

- the OC has the right to personally invite two athletes.
- the FEI has the right to nominate one athlete.

The number of athletes of the host nation will not be more than 50 % of all starters.

One groom per athlete.

FEI Wildcards have to be applied for by closing date of nominated entries through the respective NF with the FEI Dressage Department.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

**D. CVI 2\***

2. German athletes

- Individuals: all members of the German A-cadre Vaulting 2008/2009 (in case members of the A cadre will not be able to participate the „DOKR-Disziplinbeirat“ (German Vaulting Committee) may nominate further individuals.
- Teams: all members of the German A-cadre Vaulting 2008/2009 (in case a team of the A cadre will not be able to participate the „DOKR-Disziplinbeirat“ (German Vaulting Committee) may nominate further teams.

**E. CIC 3\***

Up to a total of approx. 30 athletes:

- foreign athletes who will an invitation through their home NF from the OC.
- German athletes who will get a special starting permission by the federal trainer Eventing

Number of horses per athlete: 2, 6 years and over. One groom per athlete.

**VI. QUALIFICATION OF ATHLETES & HORSES**

A Qualifying Result (QR) is achieved by completing a competition within minimum parameters of all round performance. As follows:

- Dressage Test: not more than 75 penalty points  
and
- Cross Country Test CIC:
  - if one qualifying result is required: at least once 0 penalties at obstacles
  - if two qualifying results are required: at least once 0 penalties at obstacles and at least once not more than 20 penalties at obstaclesQualifying Results (Cross Country test: not more than 20 penalties at obstacles) achieved in 2007/2008 remain valid in 2009 and Qualifying Results achieved in 2008 remain valid in 2010.

not more than 90 seconds exceeding the optimum time in the Cross. For 4\* events, the maximum time by which the optimum time may be exceeded is 120 seconds as from 2005; and

- Jumping Test not more than 16 penalties at obstacles.  
Exemptions to this rule will only be possible acc. to Art. Art. 506.6. and Art. 506.8, 9,10.

#### **3. Certification of Qualification for Events**

- 3.1 All NFs, including the host nation, are responsible to certify that Athletes and horses entered by them in international events are correctly qualified in accordance with all the requirements of the Rules.
- 3.2 All qualifying events must be identified, and any national events must be certified as of at least the equivalent standard of difficulty as the relevant international star level of competition.
- 3.3 The Technical Delegate or his nominee shall check that all horses and Athletes starting at all International events are properly certified as qualified by their NF or duly exempted in accordance with this article.

#### **4. Qualifying Period and Deadline**

- 4.1 QRs for CIOs, CCIs and CICs must be obtained in the calendar year in question or the 2 preceding calendar years.
- 4.2 The deadline for obtaining the final CIC/CNC QR is 10 days before the Cross Country test of the event unless an earlier date is specified in the Schedule. The deadline for obtaining the CCI QR is 24 days before the Cross Country test of the event unless an earlier date is specified in the Schedule.
- 4.3 Qualifications may be achieved as a combination or separately by Athlete and horse.

## **2. Grooms**

In the accreditation office, each groom of the CSI4\*, CSI-Amateurs, CDI4\*, CVI2\* and CIC3\* will receive vouchers for each day of the event (breakfast and one meal / 29 May, morning to 1 June, noon). Accommodation will be made available upon request at athlete's expense. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC. Caravans and live-in lorries can be parked near the stables (as far as space will be sufficient). If possible, the stable manager will provide for electric supply (no self-service!). For the electric supply, a nonrecurring fee of € 60 incl. VAT has to be paid to the stable manager. Sufficiently long cables have to be brought along.

## **3. HORSES**

All horses taking part in the CSI4\*/CSI-Amateurs/CDI4\*/CVI2\* will be stabled free of charge in mobile boxes (1<sup>st</sup> bedding included). Boxes for max. 4 horses (CSI), max. 3 horses (CSI-Amateurs) and for max. 2 horses (CDI) may be reserved. Only boxes can be reserved for horses competing in the event. The athlete himself has to take care of fodder and bedding. The required number of boxes must be ordered with the entry. No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance. For waste disposal a fee of € 40,00 /box (incl. VAT) will be charged. For shavings an additional fee will be charged. Boxes for horses taking part in the CIC3\* a fee of 150,00 € (incl. waste disposal and VAT) will be charged. Stabling costs for horses additionally brought to the event: 140,- EUR incl. VAT. Forage and further can be bought at prices of the day. Only the assigned stables are allowed to be used. or he may buy Mangers have to be brought along.  
The OC grants no reimbursement of transport charges.

## **4. WELCOME**

The fee will be payable at closing date of entries by means of a crossed cheque. Costs for current supply and forage will be invoiced in addition on site for all Athletes. 12,50 CHF per horse will be charged as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the Athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

For German Athletes only the German Athletes cheques are permitted with valid horse stickers or German Athletes may enter through the German online system (NeOn). Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to, Late entries or alterations will only be accepted on consultation with the OC.

The number and kind of the boxes needed, the number of needed electricity as well as the number of needed hotel rooms (incl. date of arrival and departure) etc. have to be given with the entries. If the entries do not include any information with regard to hotel, number of boxes and/or electricity, the OC reserves one box per horse entered. The costs have to be paid without fail on settlement of accounts. Hotel rooms will only be booked on order.

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 35,00 EUR per horse.

**2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES**

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 11<sup>th</sup> Edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23<sup>rd</sup> edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CC13\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

**VIII. MISCELLANEOUS**

**1. PROTESTS**

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

## **2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY**

8 athletes to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition. The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 11).

## **3. DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES**

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

## **4. INSURANCES**

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

## **5. LIABILITY**

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

## **6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the respective FEI Department by the Foreign Judge.

## **7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS**

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to athletes, one partner per athlete, one groom per athlete and per horse two owners (max. 2 horses per athlete acc. to FEI-passport), provided the names have been given to the show office before the event starts. This rule applies only to athletes of the international competitions. Entry Right to stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

## **8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS**

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**

**FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
